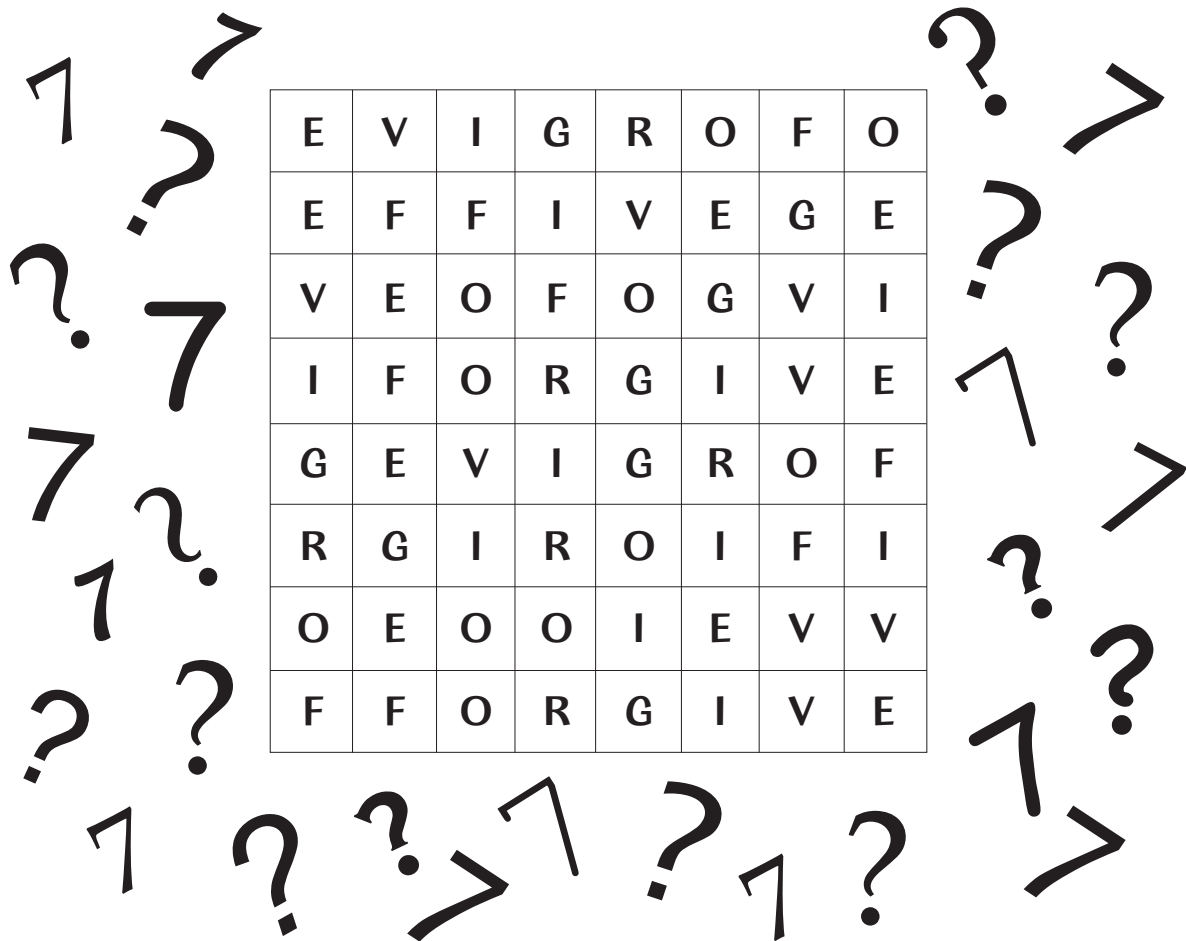
Forgive—Times Seven

One day Jesus said to his disciples, “Forgive people who say they are sorry when they do wrong. Even if someone mistreats you seven times in one day and says, ‘I am sorry,’ you should forgive that person.” (See Luke 17:3-4.)

The number seven had a special meaning in those days. It meant a number so big you

couldn't count that high. Jesus used the number seven to mean we must forgive one another over and over and over again, just as God forgives us.

Can you find five loaves of bread and two little fish hidden in this picture? When you finish, color the picture.

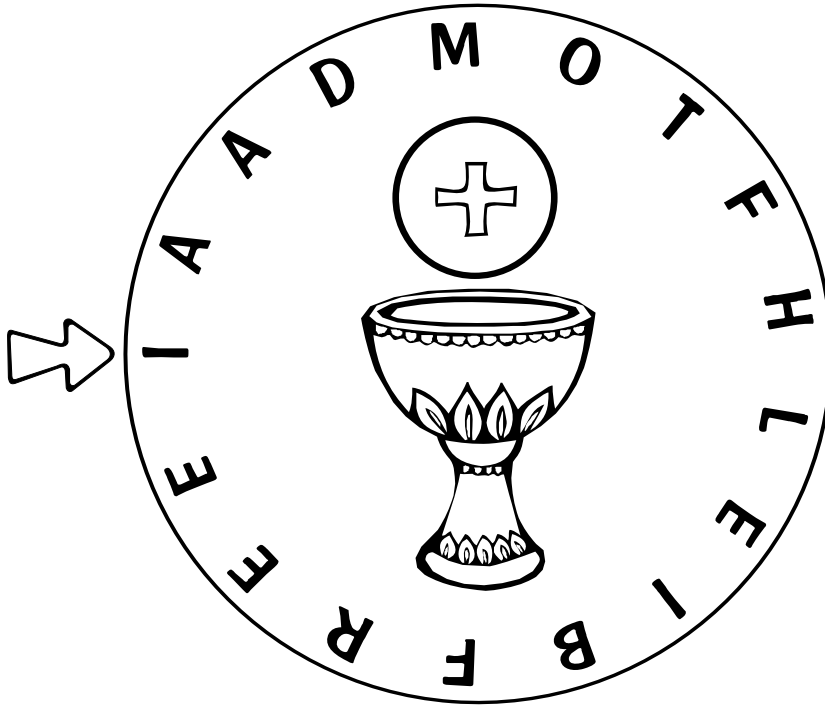
