Our Savior Is Born

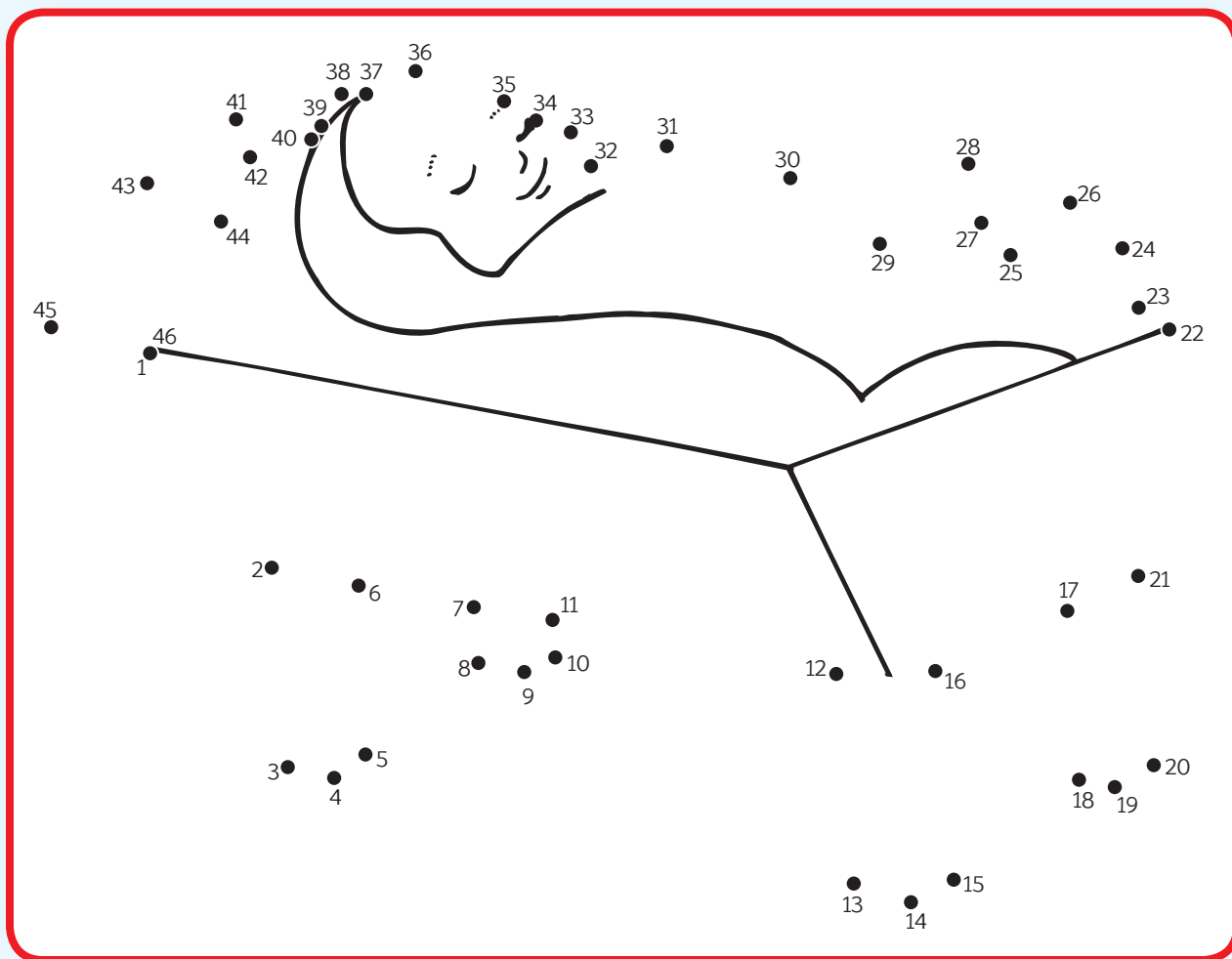

Family Corner

Faith Focus

It's a challenge to keep the family focused on the true meaning of Christmas. Trees, tinsel, trains, and toys are hard to compete with!

During Advent, you may have helped with an outreach program to help the poor enjoy a few gifts and a nice holiday meal. Try to remain involved in these activities year round. Show your children that Christmas is the birth, or "beginning," of a year of helping others, as Jesus did throughout his life.

Family Activity

On Christmas, before the gifts are opened, set aside an empty box. Ask each family member to save a piece of wrapping paper from one gift. After all gifts are opened, tape or glue each piece of paper to the outside of the box. You'll have a box decorated with a colorful Christmas collage. Attach a tag or sign that says, "Jesus Is Our Best Gift." Keep the box under the tree throughout the Christmas season.
