IMMACULATE CONCEPTION **OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY** December 9

🛧 Today's Gospel » LUKE 1:26-38 🛧

An angel named Gabriel ... was to deliver God's message to a woman engaged to a man named Joseph. The woman's name was Mary (1:26-27).

Advent is a time of preparation for the birth of Jesus. It is a season that gives us a special opportunity to think about Mary. She is, of course, a key person at the birth of Jesus!

Although the Immaculate Conception of Mary is not a Holy Day in 2019, there are usually six Holy Days of Obligation celebrated in the United States (but only two in Canada). Below are four out of six. Each of these Holy Days involves Mary. See if you can match the date and the feast with the reason it is celebrated.

- Mary is the Mother of Jesus, who is the Second Person of the Trinity.
 - Mary was taken into heaven body and soul.
- Mary was sinless from the very beginning of her life.
- Mary gave birth to Jesus, Our Lord and Savior.

MARY AND JOSEPH (Matthew and Luke, Chapters 1 and 2)

Mary has 333 titles and is celebrated on 54 feast days around the world each year! She is honored by many nations and denominations and is especially beloved by Catholics.

When we first learn about Jesus, we also learn about Mary, his mother. From the Gospels, we know that Mary was important to Jesus throughout his life.

Here is what we learn about Joseph from the Bible.

- He was descended from the royal line of David.
- He was a righteous man and the husband of Mary.
- He was present at Jesus' birth.
- With Mary, he presented baby Jesus to God in the Temple.
- He took Mary and Jesus to Egypt to escape King Herod.
- He took them back to Nazareth when it was safe.
- He shared Mary's worries when Jesus was presumed lost on a journey home from Jerusalem.
- He cared for and protected Jesus as he grew into adulthood.

Joseph is the patron for many, including carpenters, fathers, farmers, the dying, engineers, the family, and house hunters. He is revered and honored by all for his faithfulness to God, Mary, and Jesus.
